There is a need to deliver sustainability while solving the urban problem. Urban areas are usually warmer than their rural surroundings, a phenomenon known as the "heat island effect." Urban heat islands (UHIs) can affect communities by increasing summertime peak energy demand, air pollution heat-related illness and mortality, and water quality. This course provides a broad overview of the UHI effects and UHI mitigation strategies in mega-cities around the world. The course explores how UHIs form and how communities can reduce the UHI effects, with a focus on understanding urban development processes and principles. Students will learn sustainable urban management and current practices of urban sustainability, including appreciating and respecting the diversity of views and values that influence sustainable development.

This course contains three parts. First, the course provides comprehensive case studies of nature-based solutions for UHI mitigation, with a focus on sustainable urban management. Second, thematic issues will be explored in urban environment, including green roof and solar roof, Instagram and food loss/waste, and heat wave and urban redevelopment (management). The course emphasizes urban sustainability that includes environmental, social, and economic dimensions. Third, some good experiences and lessons learnt on managing cities will be reviewed. Students will learn a multi-disciplinary approach that can develop and implement a local community action plan for making city/community more healthy, habitable, resilient, and sustainable.

Yet, we often fail to consider the politics behind this cultural shift and the complexity of what we mean by "Japanese popular culture." This course invites you to examine how the current Japan boom came about and how cultural exports are transforming domestic creative industries. This course will peer behind the scenes of specific popular culture sectors in Japan, in order to break down the so-called "Cool Japan" phenomenon into its constituent parts. Students will be invited to contribute through their own knowledge and perspectives into the re-examination of what we mean by "Japanese popular culture" today.

In the second half, the focus shifts to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We examine contemporary issues of sustainability through case studies, with a focus on developing the ability to look at the world from a systems perspective. In the last several weeks, we learn how to develop an action plan toward achieving the SDGs, which requires an evaluation of past practices, the assessment of scientific and technological developments, and balanced judgements based on projected future economic, social and environmental impacts.</p>

St. Helens (USA). In addition to the basics of volcanology such as volcano-forming rocks and minerals, this course discusses how scientists and the relevant government agencies predict volcanic eruptions and other volcano-related disasters and how they mitigate the subsequent hazards, using the textbook and the materials from the USGS (United States Geological Survey) and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency).
43	2021	FS	T5	Undergraduate	300	College of Liberal Arts and Sciences	Z11320401	環境変動と自然災害	Environmental Change and Natural Disaster	YOSHIDA Shuji	English		1	This course explores the mechanisms of climate changes since the emergence of human about 2.6 million years ago, focusing on the cause (both natural and human-induced events or activities) and the effect of ongoing global warming, including natural disasters which have been increasing in frequency and magnitude in recent years worldwide. To better understand this issue, we study the climate change in a hierarchy of time scales ranging from tens of years to 100,000s years of cyclicity. Next, we discuss the cause and effect on each cyclicity or episodicity with a multi-disciplinary approach: from the viewpoints of not only natural sciences such as geology, biology, and physics, but also sociology, psychology, politics, international relationships, and other political/cultural sciences. For case studies of both climate-related environmental changes and natural disasters, we use a wide range of examples from all over the world.

Before each class, every student is expected to (1) study the basics of brain science using a popular textbook on brain science written for the general public, (2) do homework on the content of each chapter, and (3) prepare for group discussion before attending each flipped-teaching class. Each student gives a couple of short solo presentations or speeches on different brain-health topics. This year we adopt PDF dissemination of PowerPoint presentation (each page is made of a single straightforward slide and short script a la handout; total 5-7 pages). Students exchange their ideas on Moodle to compare their opinions more objectively and get feedback from others to reinforce their critical-thinking skills.
