	whose Japanese level is equivalent to JLPT N2,
	who can read and write about 1000 Kanji.
Japanese 500	Designed for students:
	who have already studied intermediate Japanese for about 200 hours,
	whose Japanese level is equivalent to JLPT N3.
Japanese 400	Designed for students:
	who finished studying basic and pre-intermediate Japanese and can
	communicate and deal with everyday situations in Japanese,
	whose Japanese level is equivalent to JLPT N4,
	who can read and write Hiragana and Katakana accurately and read
	and write more than 300 Kanji.
Japanese 300	Designed for students:
